DIA creates welcoming spaces that promote personal growth, lifelong learning, and community empowerment.

DIA's mission centers on nurturing strong, engaged Muslim individuals who actively contribute to the fabric of Canadian society. Through partnerships with diverse cultural and faith groups, DIA works to strengthen neighbourhoods, foster mutual respect, and build bridges across communities.

The **Downtown Islamic Association (DIA)** currently operates **AI Faruq Islamic School – South Campus**, located on the **5-acre property purchased outright in 2016**, for approximately 1.5M at:

In addition to our in-person program, we also provide **online learning** to serve families who cannot access the centre due to distance limitations, such as in COVID days, with a certified teacher through video conferencing, directly linked to the classrooms in the South.

6. Curriculum Update at Al Faruq Islamic School

 As part of school improvement, Kindergarten to Grade 6 English Language Arts, Social Studies, Mathematics, and Physical Education and Wellness will reflect the newly introduced curriculum changes at Al Faruq Islamic School, starting this academic year.

Outcome:

 Student learning, development, and academic growth are consistently supported through intentional strategies and assessments.

Strategies:

- Arabic Language Instruction for all students to build proficiency and cultural identity.
- Integration of Islamic Studies and Quran into daily routines and across subjects to nurture faithbased learning.
- Literacy Integration in English Language Arts (ELA) across grade levels through daily reading, writing, and comprehension strategies.
- Provincial Achievement Tests (PAT) administered to Grades 6 and 9 students in the spring.
- Student Learning Assessments (SLA) administered to Grade 3 students in the fall.

- **Surveys** for students, parents, and staff conducted in the spring (provincial, national, and school-based).
- Diagnostic Reading Assessments administered in fall, winter, and spring to monitor reading development.
- Math Assessments conducted in the fall and spring to track numeracy progress.
- Writing Assessment (HLAT) administered school-wide in the spring.
- Use of HLAT Writing Rubrics and Exemplars to ensure consistency and clear expectations.
- Empowering Writers Program implemented as a writing framework across the grades.
- ELL Professional Development and Mentoring to support teaching practices for English Language Learners.
- Professional Development on New Alberta Curriculum Implementation to equip teachers with tools and understanding to deliver updated content effectively.
